DC Cook: Historic Vote for Historic Property (January 30, 2020)



Dear DC Cook Supporters,

NENA has been working hard to prevent the threatened demolition of the DC Cook Administration Building--a beautiful and historic part of our community. Your support and voice matter: on January 22, the City Council voted to apply for local landmark status for the DC Cook building, thus delaying issuance of a demolition permit. This was an historic vote! There are two more important votes for which we'll need your support: on March 3 the Elgin Heritage Commission will vote to recommend the property for Landmark Status. On April 22, the City Council will vote whether to accept a recommendation for Landmark Status (this will require a minimum of 6 votes).

Stay tuned as we address the following KEY POINTS in our future communications:

- 1. NENA, with City support, is being proactive to find a suitable adaptive reuse for the property.
- 2. Adaptive reuse is the BEST use of the property.
- 3. The architectural and historical importance of this property warrant its protection.
- 4. We all have private property rights which are restricted by zoning and ordinances; a certificate of appropriateness for demolition is a municipal tool that protects the community.
- 5. Landmarking this property brings significant financial rewards and incentives.
- 6. Demolition is not a sustainable option: the greenest building is one that is already built.
